
Annie Sanger



My first teacher was Mrs. Maddock and I remember her teaching me how to count with miniature wooden milk bottles. During the school day, after lunch, the Infants had to have a short nap on canvas beds in the hall.



I remember this day well, walking to the cinema in a 'long crocodile' with the younger children at the front. It was a lovely sunny day.

I attended Norwich Road Primary School from 1955 to 1962. Wrapped up in heavy school coats, woolen hat and mitten all knitted by mothers and grandmothers we would race out to slide down the playground and make snowmen. We came in soaking wet!
