Our Value this half term is 'Be Proud'



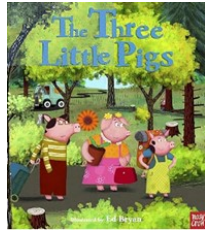

Curriculum Focus

English

English is delivered through Talk for Writing. Each half term we will use a book as our 'model text' and the children will learn a shortened version of the book. We create a story map and use actions to support our retelling as well as exploring the story through drama and other activities. This half term our text is 'The Three Little Pigs'.



Maths

This half term our maths is all about matching, sorting, comparing and measure and pattern. Part of this will be getting used to our classroom and where resources are kept, matching objects to their pictures on shelves or on boxes. We will also be comparing and sorting objects and pictures. We will use natural materials to create our own patterns and compare objects such as leaves looking at their shape and size. At the end of this half term we will spend time learning about numbers 1,2, and 3.

Phonics

Children have started their phonics lessons this week following the Little Wandle scheme. This half term they will learn 4 new phonemes (smallest unit of sound) each week. We will also be doing oral blending activities each day in preparation for reading. We are holding a phonics workshop for parents on 22nd September with information on how we teach phonics and how you can support your child at home.

Life Skills

This half term our focus is on 'self regulation'. We will be talking about our feelings and how we can express these in an appropriate way. The children will know who they can speak to if they have a concern.

We will also be exploring different strategies to help us regulate our emotions and learn all about how to follow our 'good to be green' behaviours for learning.



Understanding of the World

Our topic this half term is 'All About Me'. We will be talking about ourselves and our families and developing a sense of chronology using past, present and future. We will be thinking about where we live and the location of our school in the local area as well as the different jobs in our community.



Baseline

At the beginning of their Reception year all children will complete a baseline assessment as directed by the government. This provides us with information on how we can best support them and their learning in class. The children will sit with an adult and complete some short tasks in Maths and English.
