

This information is to be used as a general guide so parents are aware of what Remote Learning looks like at Norwich Road Academy. There are two general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school. It is important that you have signed up to Class Dojo.

Circumstance	Remote learning
My child (and their siblings if they are also attending Norwich Road Academy) is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self- isolate. The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.	 Maths lessons uploaded to Class Dojo, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school) and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home. English tasks uploaded to Class Dojo following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. The work will be a combination of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons, the book your child is working on in school, resources and worksheets used in the classroom. Some/all of these will be submitted to your child's class teacher on Class Dojo for feedback. Phonics for Early Years and KS1 to follow the sequence of Letters and Sounds videos uploaded on Class Dojo. Knowledge Curriculum task(s) following the lessons being covered in class that week. This may be the screens from the lesson being uploaded onto Class Dojo along with resources / worksheets (if appropriate i.e. if the resources required for the lessons are already at home). If the lessons being to class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set on Class Dojo which may make use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons.
My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19. We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.	 A daily overview will be uploaded with information about the learning for the day and links to resources. Maths lessons uploaded to Class Dojo, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school), the screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home. English tasks uploaded to Class Dojo following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Class Dojo for marking. This will include spelling, grammar, writing and reading. The work will be a combination of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons, the book your child is working on in school, resources and worksheets used in the classroom. Video learning which will look different depending on the age of the children. This may be guided reading sessions, maths sessions, writing sessions and Knowledge subject delivered by the class teacher. The videos will be pre-recorded by the teachers and you can access these video's on Class Dojo for children to complete and hand in virtually. This will be lessons your child would have had in class this term which can be most easily adapted to remote learning. 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 support and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support may be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will usually be expected to still complete the learning set on Class Dojo.
