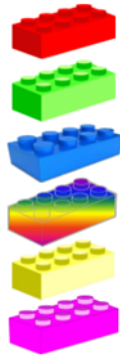




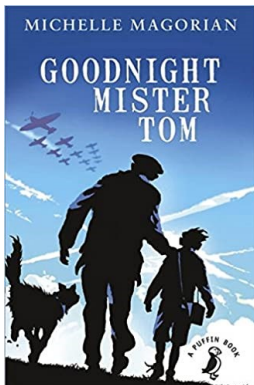
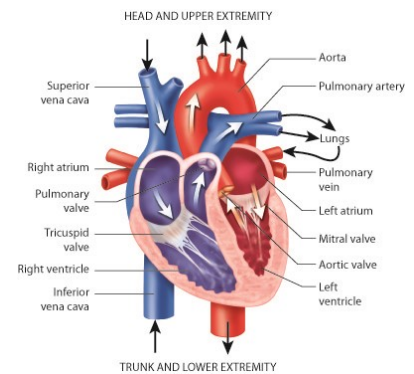
Norwich Road Academy School Values
