Maths

This term we will be learning to count beyond 20 and using this skill to count larger groups of objects. We will be continuing to practise doubles, recognise odd and even

numbers and learn pairs of numbers which equal 10.

You can help your child at home by playing games such as snakes and ladders, asking them to count groups of objects and giving them a number to 5 to double.
