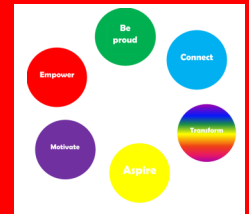




Year 1 Newsletter

Please remember not to go on the playground equipment at the start and end of the school day.

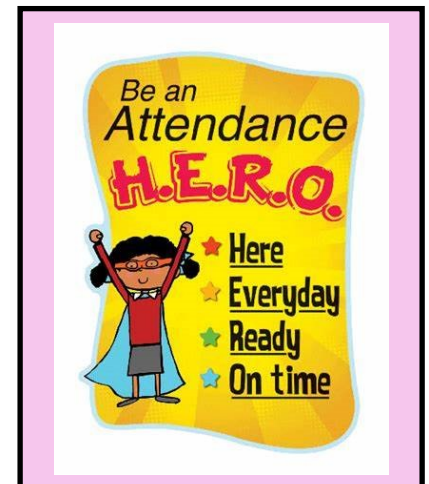
All children are expected to wear the academy uniform everyday. **Children are able to come to school in their NRA PE kits on Tuesdays and Thursdays.**

This half term the children will be focusing on our Code of Conduct including: 'SMART' Walking 'SLANT' Listening Our Smart Uniform

Politeness and manners, these are 'SPENT': 'Smile, Please, Excuse me, use a Name, Thank you'. We encourage children to demonstrate this behaviour and use these words.



Curriculum Focus

English

This half term, we are reading 'Good Little Wolf' by Nadia Shireen. We will be using our phonics to help us read and write short sentences to form a simple journey story.

We will be making sure that all of our sentences have capital letters and full stops.

Maths

We will be doing lots of learning about place value this half term. We will work on our counting skills and learn to represent and read numbers to 10 and 20.

We will develop our problem solving and reasoning skills by answering more complex questions.

Science

Our topic in Science this half term is 'The Human Body'. We will be focusing on the five senses—sight, hearing, tasting, touching and smelling. We will be learning about how the eye and the ear work as well as how our senses help us to understand the world around us.

Phonics

We will be reviewing our Phase 3 sounds over the coming weeks and move into Phase 4 during which the children will be able to read their sounds in longer and more complex words.

The children will be developing their spelling strategies by using their 'segmenting fingers';.

Art

Our topic in Art this half term is 'Colours'. The children will be learning about the primary and secondary colours. They will have the opportunity to investigate what happens when the colours are mixed. We will be looking at the work of Piet Mondrian and Claude Monet.

Life Skills

We will be discussing families and relationships during our Life Skills lessons this half term. Topics will include what families are, friendships, recognising emotions, working with others and identifying healthy friendships.

Music

Our Music lessons this half term will focus on 'Keeping the Pulse'. We will be clapping rhythms, swaying and tapping in time to the music, singing in a rhythm and performing with musical instruments!

Geography

This half term, our topic will be 'Spatial Sense'. This will include looking at maps from an aerial view, using a compass for direction and creating our own maps of familiar places.

We will have the opportunity to further explore the local area.

Computing

The children will be learning about the technology around them this half term. We will be identifying technology around us, describing the features and parts of a computer and the children will have the opportunity to practice using a mouse and keyboard.
